FRANK SMITH AHOW EXPEDITION TO CUBA

Member and offshore Dxpeditioner Frank Smith AH0W went to Cuba last April to gather material for a photo feature in the 'DX Magazine'. He visited the Cuban Buro, the national organization of Cuban hams. He could not operate a station on the amateur bands. However he was interviewed about DX-ing on the short-wave program 'DX Unlimited', hosted by Arnaldo "arnie" Coro CO2KK, science editor of Radio Habana Cuba. The program was aired over international broadcast bands April 22.

Frank has returned with a stunning and interesting array of photographs of cultural and historic artifacts and natural scenes. He also gleaned information about amateur radio in Cuba from dialogues he had with Cuban amateurs. The article is published in the Sept/Oct issue of 'DX Magazine'. Frank is assembling a slide show for presentation to radio clubs next fall and winter.

ARRL RECEIVES GRANT OF \$191,800 FROM US GOVERNMENT

The ARRL will receive a \$191,800 homeland security grant from the US government to train Amateur Radio operators in emergency communication. The League was one of many non-profit organizations designated to receive some \$10.3 million in federal money to boost homeland defense volunteer programs. The grant, from the Corporation for National and Community Service special volunteer program, will provide free ARRL Amateur Radio Emergency Communications Course training for 5,200 volunteers nationwide, starting immediately. The first group is about to begin the Radio Emergency Communications course. In the first year ARRL anticipates some 1700 hams will take the course through the Connecticut Distance Learning Concertium by e-mail. Your editor is expecting to be a mentor in the course, guiding some dozen students every eight weeks. On completion of the course and successful multiple answer question exam students receive a 'worth having' certificate.
