#### **BOOK REVIEW**

Thunderstruck by Erik Larson Publisher: Crown: October 24, 2006

Here are two stories entangled in one exciting tale. And the stories are from well documented and researched history. The setting is in Edwardian London at the turn of the 20<sup>th</sup> century. Author Larsen alternates the stories through the book. The people in the stories are presented as fully fleshed out persons rather than historic stick figures.

One story is Guglielmo Marconi's development of the first transatlantic wireless communication. Marconi was young, obsessed, unschooled in science. and secretive. He believed that electromagnetic waves could flow along the curvature of Earth's surface and cross oceans in contrast to the teaching of contemporary physicists. Physicist Sir Oliver Lodge, a rival of Marconi, insisted that electromagnetic waves were evidence that communication with a "next" world of those who had died was possible.

The other story is a tale about a crime. Dr. Hawley Crippen, a homeopathic physician was a self-effacing, mild mannered husband of shrewish woman who was a vaudeville actress. whom he is charged with murdering. He attempts to escape to Quebec on a luxury ocean liner in disguise, with his unsuspecting lover.

Crippen is pursued by Scotland Yard detective Chief inspector Walter Dew on a faster ship. Crippen did not know the world followed the chase through wireless transmissions sent to newspapers on both sides of the Atlantic.

This sensational murder brought international attention to Marconi's achievements and removed skepticism about the usefulness of wireless communication.
